Geography

Intent

The ability to express well-balanced opinions, rooted in secure knowledge and understanding about current issues in society and the environment;

A genuine interest in the subject and a real sense of curiosity about the world.

Implementation

We believe that the delivery of the Geography curriculum is as important as its design. Therefore, subjects leaders have implemented the following:

OA knowledge organiser that outlines knowledge and skills, which all children can access. These documents also provide a tool for teachers to evaluate against.

A progression of skills document which ensures that skills are developed in a logical sequence.

OA cycle of lessons, which carefully plans for progression and depth. Key knowledge and skills are revisited and repeated in order to ensure that they are embedded within long-term memory and are always building on what they have learnt before.

A series of CPD in order to ensure that staff have effective subject knowledge and are confident with delivering high quality geography lessons.

Teachers have implemented/ensured the following:

High expectations for all pupils.

Quality teaching which enables all pupils to understand key geographical concepts/vocabulary and embed them in long-term memory.

The fluent application of geographical skills, with independence.

Assessing understanding and addressing misconceptions.

The delivery of planning is based on assessment of the children's knowledge and driven by the emerging ideas/needs of the class.

Organisation of trips and visiting experts who will enhance the learning experience.
