

Brief description of main action:

Ocean Friendly Schools Award pilot for Marine Conservation Society (MCS) - Earth Ambassadors after school group to complete by end of Spring term 2, 2023. This involves engaging in a plastic-use survey of home, kitchen and school. Reporting on findings of lunchbox use in the newsletter in November and again in December. Parents drop in on a Friday afternoon 1-3pm date (TBC) to see ways they could reduce [plastic use in lunchboxes and other applications in their homes. Earth Ambassadors to run this. Develop a plastic bottle free school where all children have a school water bottle and no other bottles are allowed for their daily drinking water. Children asked to put a water bottle on Santa list for new term.

How will you plan for a wider community engagement?

Newsletter will inform parents of action plan- sent 14.11.2022 to all parents. MCS Jenny Griffiths to support journey through teams meetings with Earth Ambassadors. She will attend school to deliver the award when we complete. Use of twitter weekly after meetings to share what we have achieved. Newsletter to have regular entries to report our progress
