


At St Bernadette's we are fully committed to safeguarding our children. We expect all staff, parents and visitors to share this commitment.

School Closure

School will be closed to pupils for the half term break from **Monday 25th October to Friday 29th October.**

A reminder that school will also be closed to all pupils on **Monday 1st November** due to staff training. School will therefore resume, after the half term, on **Tuesday 2nd November** as normal.

Parking

We are continually getting complaints about the parking of some inconsiderate parents. We have kindly requested on a number of occasions that parents do not obstruct neighbouring driveways or roads, including the school driveways, and park responsibly and legally, but this appears to be falling on deaf ears of some of our parents. The situation is particularly bad on Berkeley Road where sometimes it is difficult for emergency vehicles to pass due to the parking. Please also consider the distress that you are causing to disabled members of the community and the danger you are putting our children in when you do not park sensibly. Surely parking a little further from the school and having to walk is worth the life of a child! We will therefore be working closely with West Midlands Police to ensure that any illegally parked vehicles receive a ticket.

Secondary School Application for 2022 reminder

A reminder that all secondary school applications must be completed online by 31st October 2021. Please ensure that you have visited www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions and completed the necessary information. Also ensure that you do your research about potential schools by looking at their websites and use all of the choices available. Make sure you have read the admission arrangements fully for the schools you are interested in and know how likely it is that your child will be offered a place there. Some Catholic schools require additional information to be submitted regarding baptismal details. It is important that you include at least one realistic preference for a school that your

Inclement Weather

Healthy Start

Healthy Start is a government scheme to improve the health of low-income pregnant women and families. Women who are 10+ weeks pregnant and families with children under four years old qualify if they are on benefits and tax credits. The scheme offers eligible women and families, FREE vouchers worth £4.25 (or £8.50 for a baby in the first year) to spend on milk, fruit, vegetables and first stage infant formula milk. In addition, families also receive Healthy Start vitamin vouchers.

Despite being eligible, many families in Birmingham are not registering for their Healthy Start food vouchers. This means thousands of pounds each week worth of free food is not reaching families who need it.

- To qualify for Healthy Start applicants must be 10+ weeks pregnant and/or have at least one child under 4 and be in receipt of benefits such as Child Tax Credit or Universal Credit.
- Healthy Start food vouchers can be exchanged for milk, infant formula, fruit, vegetables and pulses. You can request an application form from the Healthy Start website www.healthystart.nhs.uk/how-to-apply/ or telephone 0345 607 6823.

Uniform

Please can I remind parents that children should be wearing full winter uniform. Polo shirts should no longer be worn and pupils should be in a shirt/blouse and tie. In addition to this, can I remind girls that the wearing of leggings beneath skirts is not permitted. If girls wish to have their legs covered they should wear tights and a skirt or trousers. Furthermore, please can I remind parents that the wearing of earrings in KS1 is not permitted for health and safety reasons. Thank you to those families that do adhere to the uniform policy.


Year 3 First Holy Communion

Free School Meal Vouchers

Free school Meal vouchers will be issued again for the October half-term break. The codes and details of how to redeem the vouchers, for those who are eligible, have been issued to parents/carers via email.

The voucher codes are funded through the government's Household Support Fund, for Reception to Year 14 - each voucher code is worth £15 and for early years children the value is £10.

Voucher codes are only valid until **31st January 2022**. Therefore, You are advised to redeem your vouchers asap.

Smart Watches

It has come to my attention that some children are wearing V-Tech and other smart watches to school. These and any other watches that contain a camera are not permitted for safeguarding reasons. Therefore, if your child has been wearing one of these watches we would kindly ask that they cease to do so and wear them outside of the school day. Thank you for your co-operation with this matter.

Feast of St. John Paul II

Today, 22nd October marks the feast of St John Paul II one of our modern day saints.

- Pope John Paul II was ordained in 1946, became the bishop of Ombi in 1958, and became the Archbishop of Krakow in 1964.
- He was made a cardinal in 1967, and in 1978 became the first non-Italian pope in more than 400 years.
- In 1981, an assassin shot John Paul twice in St. Peter's Square in Vatican City. Fortunately, he was able to recover from his injuries and later forgave his attacker.
- He was a vocal advocate for human rights and used his influence to effect political change. He died in Italy in 2005.
- The sainthood ceremony was held on April 27, 2014.


